



Northside Preparatory Academy is a public charter school serving K-8 students throughout the Spring Grove and Northside communities. The school offers a well-rounded academic program that places emphasis on good citizenship and service to the community. Students are encouraged to take an active role in their education by becoming goal-oriented agents for change.



In addition to core subjects, students participate in Art and PE classes during the school day. The safe, secure campus features separate buildings for elementary and middle school programs with a gym, playground, auditorium, and dedicated art room. Northside Preparatory Academy provides instructional support for young learners with two teachers per Kindergarten classroom. Students benefit from special summer programs in Dance, STEM, and Kindergarten Readiness. Additionally, the school offers free breakfast, lunch, and on-site counseling services.

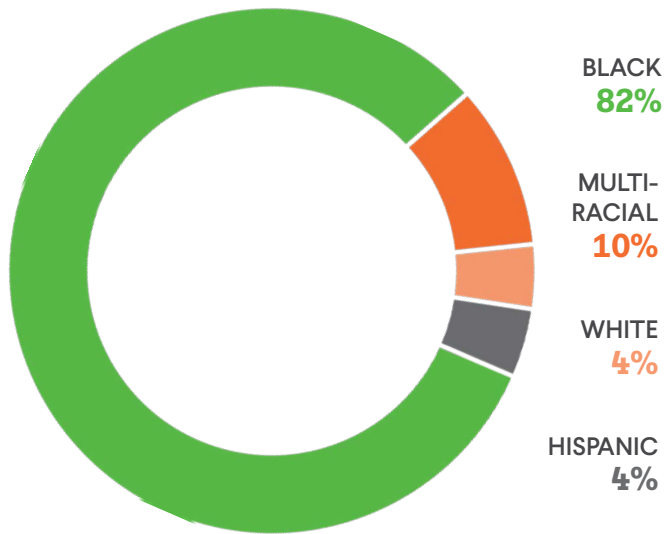

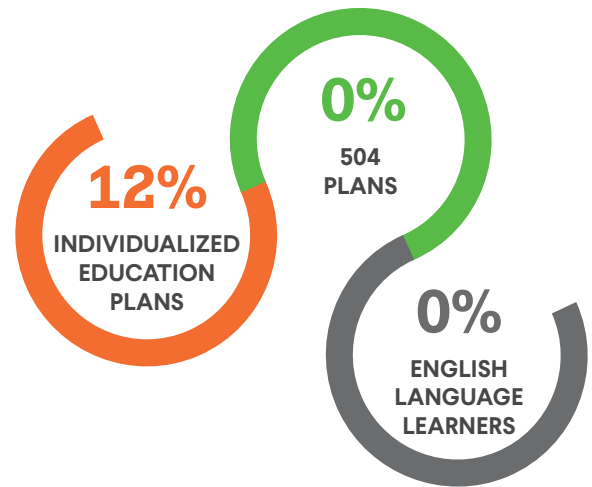

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



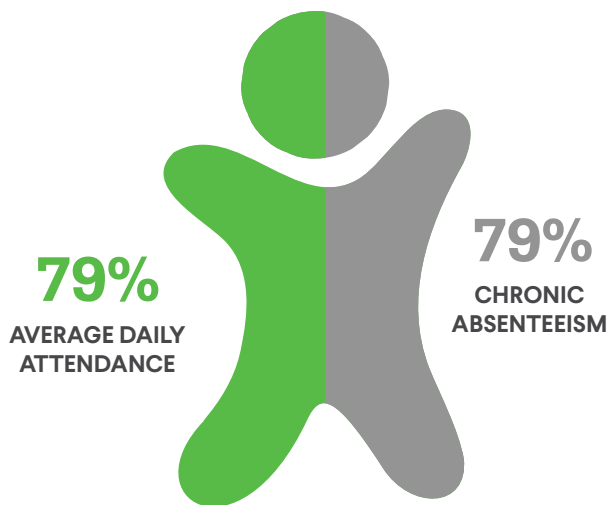

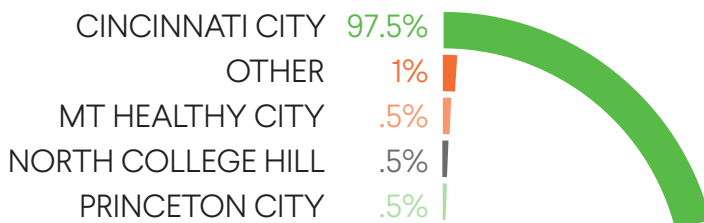

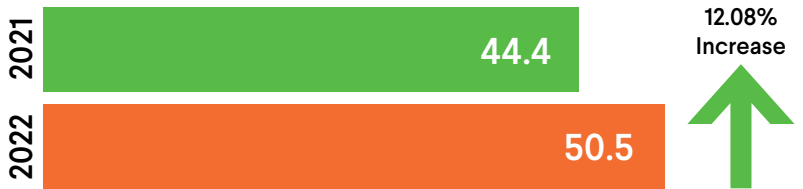

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students and instructional hours above state requirements, Northside Preparatory Academy is undergoing steady academic recovery since the pandemic. The school met state expectations for student academic growth (3 Stars, Progress) and increased its Performance Index (PI) score by over 12%. Additionally, 100% of students met the state literacy requirements for promotion to Grade 4.

YOY GROWTH IN PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE



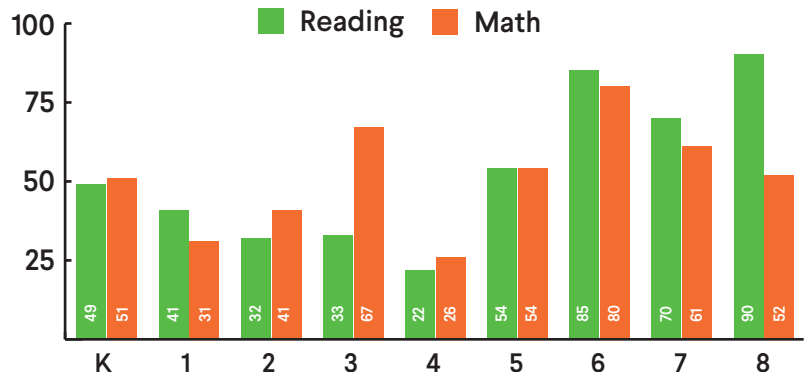

As required by state law, Richland Academy of the Arts (RAA) provides oversight, monitoring and technical assistance to the schools it sponsors including evaluating the academic, fiscal and organizational performance in various ways. In addition to assessing academic performance as measured by state report card metrics, RAA reviews various academic progress and financial reports, attends board meetings, assesses compliance with state and federal rules and laws, and conducts school site visits.

State law also requires RAA to submit written reports on the evaluation of school academic, financial and organizational performance, and legal compliance, to the Ohio Department of Education annually by November 30.
