Northside Preparatory Academy is a public charter school serving K-8 students throughout the Spring Grove and Northside communities. The school offers a well-rounded academic program emphasizing good citizenship and socialemotional wellbeing. In addition to core subjects, students participate in Art and PE classes during the school day.

The safe, secure campus features separate buildings for elementary and middle school programs with a gym, playground, auditorium, and dedicated art room. Northside Preparatory Academy provides instructional support for young learners with two teachers per Kindergarten classroom. Using Restorative Practices and PBIS, the school cultivates a positive learning environment. Students benefit from free breakfast, lunch, and afterschool tutoring.

## HIGHILIGHTS

- Rated 3 stars on Progress for meeting state standards in student academic growth
- Achieved year-over-year performance increase
- $100 \%$ of students met the state requirements for promotion to Grade 4
- Provided 1154 instructional hours, 25\% more than the Ohio requirement for charter schools
- Campus improvements included upgrading outdoor play areas with new mulch and blacktop paint for games like hopscotch \& three square
- Purchased two new Book Vending Machines for students to earn books through PBIS program
- Started a Gardening Club for all grade levels
- Adopted restorative practices to build school culture; student successes were noted through bi-weekly Community Circle groups, celebration assemblies \& field trips (Grades 6-8)
- Hosted a successful 6-week summer school program
- Provided free afterschool tutoring



## ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students and instructional hours above state requirements, Northside Preparatory Academy met state expectations for student academic growth (3 Stars, Progress). The school additionally increased its Performance Index (PI) score and $100 \%$ of students met the state literacy requirements for promotion to Grade 4.
