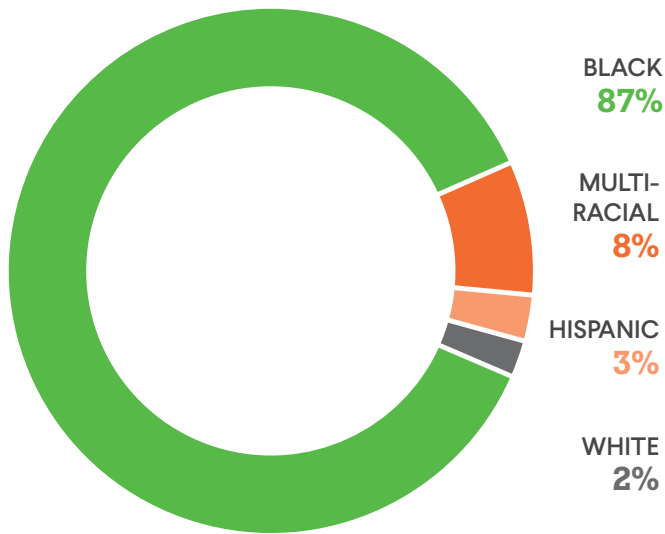

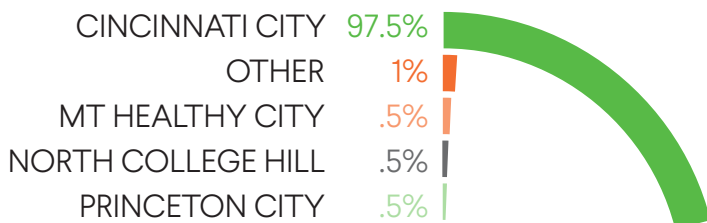

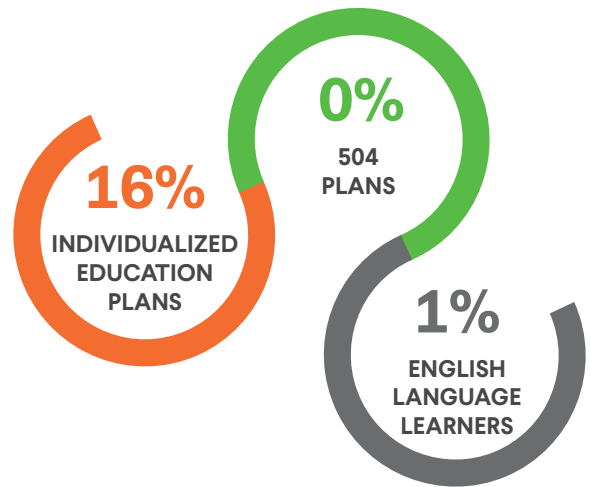

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Rated 3 stars on Progress for meeting state standards in student academic growth
- Achieved year-over-year performance increase
- 100% of students met the state requirements for promotion to Grade 4

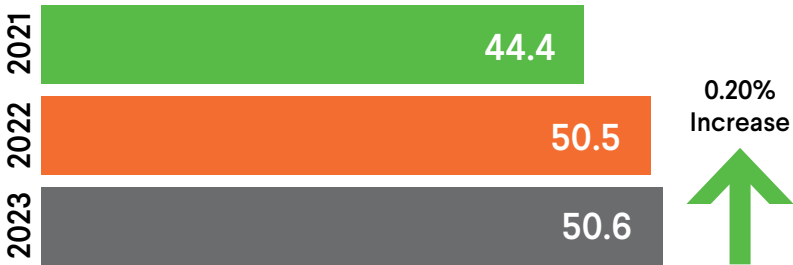

YOY PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE



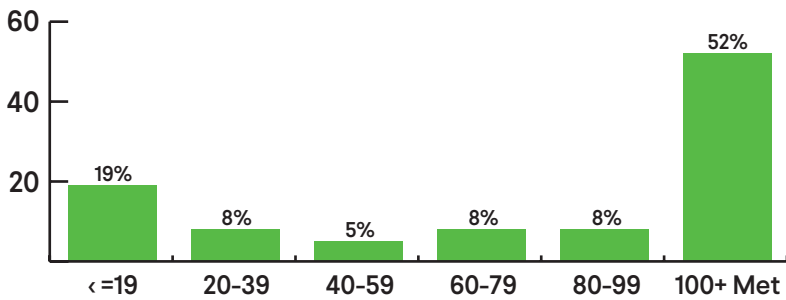
